

Dear Leader,

It's always nice when an investment pays off!

And that's the case when it comes to the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP). CHIP was created in 1997 with bipartisan support and, along with the Medicaid program, has cut the rate of uninsured kids by 50% (from 14% to 7%). [1]

This dramatic increase in kids' coverage has a tangible, positive impact on our nation's future health and education. Kids who have health insurance are less likely to get sick and more likely to get preventative care (including immunizations and dental care) to keep them well. It also helps them get the treatment they need when they do get sick, injured, or have a recurring illnesses. [2]

For these reasons, CHIP has earned the support of 83% of Americans because it is a smart investment in our kids' future.[3]

The stories in this booklet represent a small portion of the over 8 million children covered by CHIP yet these personal experiences reflect the widespread value and importance of CHIP coverage. [4] Unless Congress acts quickly to extend funding for the CHIP program, most these children will become uninsured. We can't let that happen.

Let's continue investing in our kids through the Children's Health Insurance Program to ensure that we always give our kids a winning hand of lifelong health. We urge you to take action this year to continue funding for this critical health coverage.

As a teen I lived in a small rural town. There were no medical facilities in town at the time. When I was seventeen, and four months pregnant, I suffered from a Cerebral A.V.M. rupture; basically an aneurysm. It was classified as a stroke. The prognosis was that I was going to be a vegetable and my baby would not live, or have so many birth defects that it was recommended we abort the pregnancy.

Long story short, it has been 18 years since my stroke I am a working mom of 4, happily married to a man who has stood by me for the last 20 years, and I am very active in my community. I would never have gotten past the vegetative state if CHIP wasn't available as it covered my much needed physical therapy and the equipment I desperately needed to get me to a point in my recovery where I could function independently.

When I had recovered enough to do so, I returned to school and even continued to college. Now I am serving others in the disability community as an Assistive Technology Assistant. I vote in every election and care deeply about my country. God Bless!


Bunny (Ruth), Arizona

Dulce, Florida


I became disabled in 2002 and lost our insurance coverage when I was no longer able to work. I was covered by Medicare but my daughter had no coverage. Had it not been for the Healthy Kids program she would have remained uninsured. She was able to get coverage through KidCare [CHIP in FL] until she turned 19 and had graduated from high school.

I don't know what would have happened had she not had this coverage. Every child should have the right to coverage, a child needs health insurance and it is our duty to make sure they receive it.

Rebecca, Florida

This isn't a story about me but about my brother. After numerous months of pain and going in and out of the hospital he was diagnosed with Crohn's at 15. The next couple of years he underwent complications, surgery, weeks in the hospital, and now is on different types of medications in order to live a normal life.

Almost four years later and he is stable as long as he has his medication. Were it not for KidCare [CHIP in



FL], he most likely would not have gotten the care he needed and my mom would be in debt and unable to hold down a steady home for her three children by herself.

Debra, Florida

My husband works for a small private startup company. Even though he works in excess of sixty hours a week, the company does not provide affordable healthcare. Through his employer, we purchased a policy for \$500a month, which covers very limited care for both my husband and I. This policy comes with a ten thousand dollar deductible. We are only able to visit our primary care physician for our \$35 co-pay, any labs or testing must first meet the enormous deductible. The deductible alone is 1/3 of our take home pay. This kind of policy would put our children's health in jeopardy. It would literally mean choosing between treating an illness and meeting a mortgage payment.

Even though we have been blessed with healthy children, are able to minimize the policy's use, the healthcare insurance through the state of Florida has been a huge peace of mind. With increasing costs and taxes every way we turn, there is less and less for those of us in the private industry to continue to afford decent healthcare, in addition to trying to save for retirement. I sometimes do not feel that those who are fortunate enough to have their policies and retirements paid for by the taxpayers appreciate the gift. Having KidCare [CHIP in FL] has been a lifeline for us, one we hope we never really have to use it.

If it was not for Florida KidCare [CHIP in FL], my two daughters would not have health insurance. I am only slightly above the median [income] that disqualifies me for Medicaid and I cannot afford the astronomical prices of regular health insurance for my family. It gives me peace of mind to know that if anything health related were to happen, my children are covered.

When my daughter was 19 months old, she had a sudden seizure and fell backwards while I was giving her a bath. I was alone with her and couldn't leave her to dial 911, so I rushed out of my house calling for help, clutching my naked child who was seizing in my arms. Fortunately, my next-door neighbors were

home and I fell to my knees and placed my child on the floor and prayed as they called for an ambulance. Her lips were already turning blue. She stopped seizing shortly thereafter and was unconscious for the next 35 minutes.

She was diagnosed with febrile seizures that day. She has had five other seizures since, each brought on by moderate fevers. Each one was just as frightening as the first. Another thing that was just as frightening for me? Being an unemployed single mom, attempting to start a business, and worrying about how I would pay the medical bills if I had to rush my girl to the hospital.

Thankfully, I was able to get her insured through the CHIP. This critical program provides health insurance for children of low-to-moderate income families like mine. It is imperative that this program stay in place to help others as it helped me.

My grandson was diagnosed with Type 1 Diabetes at the age of 4 1/2. He also has been diagnosed with Celiac Disease and Asperger's Syndrome. Without the PeachCare coverage [CHIP in GA] I don't know what we would have done. The care he has received has been remarkable! Our precious children are suffering from so many diseases and they deserve the best care available. It is crucial that CHIP continues to provide the help for our children and grandchildren that is so desperately needed.

I raised 3 girls by myself and thank God there was a Children's Health Insurance Program as one had a birth defect and required surgery.

We have had Hawk-i [CHIP in IA] for three years now, not quite half of my daughter's life. My Husband is self-employed and I work at a Food Co-op. He has no health insurance coverage at his job and I am given a taxable stipend which does not even cover health insurance for the two of us, and has a very high deductible. We are grateful to not have to worry or think twice about taking charge of our daughter's health. We do not hesitate to bring her to the doctor, get her vaccinations, or take her to the dentist twice a year since we have the coverage through Hawk-i. Thanks for your time. We are grateful!

When my husband lost his job and insurance we had no idea what we would do. We knew that we did not qualify for Title 19, but we were told to apply for the Hawk-i [CHIP in IA] program. To our surprise we qualified and were approved. At first we were concerned that it wouldn't cover all the medical needs, but that was not the case.



Hawk-i actually covered my son's hemophilia drugs

and all the specialists that came with it. The only thing I wish that was covered would be orthodontists. Our daughter was born 9 weeks early and her mouth was misshapen requiring a lot of orthodontics to properly form it, and Hawk-i says that it is considered "cosmetic."

Heather, Idaho



I worked for an employer who offered healthcare at a discounted price, for the employees only - not their families. As a result, everyone employed there was ineligible for the tax credits to be able to buy insurance in our state's insurance exchange, including my family and me. The Affordable Care

Act, unfortunately, passed us, and everyone else whose employer offered healthcare on those terms, completely by. If CHIP were not available to my children, I don't know what we would have done.

Anyone who has raised kids knows, you HAVE to have insurance for them – stuff happens, from sore throats and ear infections, right on up to jumping off the roof. I still don't make enough money to pay for private insurance, and pay the bills. CHIP helps me to care for my kids and gives us the security of knowing that if they pick up a bug at school, we CAN take them to a doctor without giving up our grocery budget. CHIP is necessary, and I'm grateful for it.

Virginia, Idaho

CHIP helped my 3 sons and I know it helps a lot of my family and friends, too. Please don't take CHIP from the kids.

Linda, Idaho

We needed CHIP. In 1989 we returned from volunteer work doing community development in Zambia, southern Africa. We were a young healthy couple with a 1-year old daughter

and at that point insurance seemed less important than rent and food. We had total savings of 3K dollars. Our daughter had an intense allergic reaction and ended up in intensive care for 3 days and that wiped out our savings completely. Our hope and intentions were to get master's degrees and return to Africa for a life of volunteer work. This single episode of illness at hospital rates that seem ridiculously low now, changed our whole life trajectory.

My husband had to drop out of grad school and scramble to find work. He did not finish a master's for another 15 years. By that time I was our family's primary wage-earner and in a demanding role as pastor in our congregation, our kids were in high school and not in a good stage to move halfway around the world, and our dreams of Africa stayed on the shelf.

After our kids left home we did return to Africa and are currently working in Tanzania, again as volunteers. However, we can't make the long term commitments demanded to foster real grassroots change at this stage in our lives and we have some deep regrets. All for \$3,000 of medical bills at a vulnerable stage.

If not for CHIP, my beloved granddaughter would have not received the excellent healthcare in her young (5 year old) life.

Her family has one less worry and her health has been excellent thanks to this care

I lost my job when I got pregnant. My husband's insurance was enough, until I developed complications.

My son was born 6 weeks early and then spent 11 weeks in the NICU. If it hadn't been for All Kids [CHIP in IL], we would have been in huge debt.

As a single parent, I depend on All Kids [CHIP in IL] for both of my school-aged children, and would be at a total loss without this program, as I could not afford the health insurance that was offered through my job. Now that I have been laid off, it's more important than ever.

Patricia, Illinois

As a mother, I am not on top of everything. I had brain surgery 10 years ago and still managed to get married and have a child. I have not been able to keep steady work and am in school now trying to improve my health and my opportunities through acupuncture. I have not been able to afford healthcare for my child

Through IL All Kids [CHIP in IL], Leontyn has had all of her appointments with doctors, dentists, which afforded me the opportunity to have her eyes checked. When she was stricken with RSV pneumonia at 2 months, All Kids assured her well-being by taking care of her medical expenses.

In 13 months, she had 2 spider bites which ended up in cellulitis and an overnight stay each time. I could not afford the hospital stay but while I slept next to her in the hospital bed I was proud that I lived in a state that felt she was worthy of saving even if her mom didn't have her act together.

As I finish my first year in my Masters of Science in Traditional Oriental Medicine, I know how blessed I am that my daughter has been taken care of throughout my journey of recovering from illness and trauma. Please keep giving children the opportunity to grow up healthier than I did so that they will be more capable of contributing to society.

I've worked as a teacher with students who live in impoverished situations. Without All Kids [CHIP in IL], the majority of kids I've come into contact with would be without healthcare. This is a serious issue. Healthcare is a human right. It sets people up on their path.

My story begins 12 years ago when I found out I was pregnant (after being told I couldn't have kids). I found out about WIC and immediately enrolled, which helped me eat healthier during my pregnancy. I applied for public aid and was able to have doctors involved throughout. This really paid off when I got HELP syndrome (pre-eclampsia) and we both almost died.

I am so thankful someone saved my baby and my life! If I didn't have insurance I am not sure we would both be alive to-day! Insurance has kept my son healthy because of wellness visits and a doctor whenever he's sick. Having bee sting allergies the Epi-Pen has saved his life more than once! Plus seeing a specialist for all his allergies.

Thank you insurance! I couldn't afford insurance along with bills, housing, food, and supporting my injured fiancé. Also I have used Illinois Action For Kids so I can continue to work and earn money while knowing my son was in a safe environment! I don't know how kids can stay healthy, educated, and well without insurance and help. It takes a community to raise a child.

We are long-time CHIP receivers and are very grateful for the coverage. I have one daughter who had severe asthma as a

young child which required many expensive daily medications and even occasional trips to the ER when she got sick and her condition worsened. She was saved more than once because of our health coverage through CHIP.

I also have another daughter who fell off of a bunk bed and suffered a subdural Hematoma and nearly died, she required emergency brain surgery to relieve the pressure. Once again we were so very grateful to have coverage and not need to worry about hospital bills at a time like that. Thankfully, both of my girls are now older and both are healthy and strong with no lasting effects from their conditions.

I thank you for providing CHIP in the past for our family and others like us and hope you will continue to do so. Please don't cut funding!

My daughter has had chronic migraines since the age of 6 and until we had CHIP, I was unable to provide medication for her (it was cut off when she turned 18).

She is now earning her Ph.D. at Harvard University and continues to use migraine medication. My son has allergies and the K-CHIP has enabled me to take him to doctors and get the medications he needs to stay healthy. Please keep this program.

I attended graduate school when my kids were toddlers. I am now a breadwinner for my family. Without the safety net of CHIP while I invested in a new career, I would not have been able to better our lives. It's the right thing to do. Children need to be protected. Parents need to be free from worry.

I'm a single mother of four and though I am gainfully employed I cannot afford my employer's healthcare plan for my children at this time. If it weren't for the CHIP program my children would be uninsured and we would drown financially.

I've been blessed to receive free coverage when my income was extremely low and have also been allowed to pay a much



smaller premium when blessed with additional income. During both of these phases of life the coverage provided through the CHIP program has been lifesaving.

Three of my children are asthmatic and also wear glasses; basic healthcare is costly enough but when you combine that with additional medical concerns the cost can become overwhelming. On behalf of all parents, joint and single, I pray that the CHIP program remains a source of support for our children.

After 5 years with the same company I thought my life was stable until an economic slide took my job overseas and left me without any benefits. My son was 5 at the time and I was pregnant with another.

My son woke me up one night unable to breathe - the scariest minutes of my life proved that my son would need ongoing medication. Luckily the hospital had to see us but the follow up and prescriptions would surely make it hard to continue day-to-day life, paying bills, and still able to support my children. The hospital referred me to Medicaid who accepted my son into the NC Health Choice [CHIP in NC] where I pay a once a year reduced fee and low copays.

This eased the burden and allowed my son to continue to have a healthy life. Even though I am working again the coverage for my family would take 1/4 of my paycheck each paycheck. That is not something I can afford with living expenses and gas. Without the NC Choice program I know we would not be able to survive.

Denelle, Ohio

As a child growing up with diabetes, I was growing up under my parents' healthcare coverage and had a hard time finding coverage on my own when applying for jobs.

I was fortunate enough to be able to finally find good insurance, which was indeed fortunate, since my healthcare was in use frequently. I would hate to see any child, or any adult, for that matter, with mine or any healthcare problem, try to cover these expenses without good insurance!

We have not received CHIP. However, it helps us because it helps our friends, neighbors, and our community.

Therese, Ohio

Before my husband became settled in his current career, he was working a number of odd jobs, trying to make a living. I was working part time and taking care of two young children as well. The amount of money we made qualified our children for the Healthy Start [CHIP in OH] program. At this time, I had a baby who was born with a congenital condition requiring an overnight hospital stay, multiple tests, and extensive follow-up appointments. My daughter is now 12 years old and still takes daily medicine for her condition, but is otherwise perfectly healthy.

I am so grateful that the Healthy Start program was available for us when we needed it. Because of the program, we were able to focus on my daughter and her medical needs when it was most important to us, and my husband was able to get settled in his current career.

Because of his change in jobs, we made too much to be eligible for Healthy Start for much more than about three years, but those three years had a huge impact on our lives. If we hadn't had assistance at that time, I believe we would still be struggling with debt today, instead of being able to contribute to society.

Miechell, Oklahoma

In the early 2000's, I was a waitress and was barely able to pay my bills, much less pay for doctor bills and medication for my sons and myself. I made too much for assistance, but my sons qualified for CHIP.

Not knowing if I would be able to take my sons to the doctor when they got sick and get their medicines was a very heavy burden. But CHIP helped to remove that burden. I was able to get medical help for my sons and that meant the world to me.

Shannon, Pennsylvania

I'm an attorney and when I was pregnant with my son I found out his coverage would've been \$400 a month through my insurance. So I had to get him on CHIP. We pay a full premium for him but in late 2008 there was a downturn in the legal community and I ended up losing my job for a few months and it was wonderful because the CHIP program gave us a reduced premium amount.

Now we are back up to paying the full amount and I think it's a valuable and wonderful program for people to be able to have and I fully support it.

This program has helped several children in the Pittsburgh, PA area as I have seen through pediatric nursing at the local children's hospital.

Sarah, Pennsylvania

Growing up, my family struggled financially. Having CHIP allowed my mother to provide my sister and me with things like eye glasses and braces which they would have never been able to afford on their own.

Then, when I was thirteen, I became severely depressed and attempted to take my own life. Because of CHIP I was able to receive psychiatric care including therapy throughout the rest of my teenage years. This treatment was invaluable to my adult life. I'm not sure if I would be alive today without it.

I had CHIP growing up. My dad was a landscape contractor and my mom owned a small gift shop.

We were devastated when my dad was disabled by an accident and CHIP got me to the doctor when I was sick. If we didn't have it, I



don't know what my family would have done to cover doctors and medications for me.

Melanie, Pennsylvania

CHIP has been very beneficial to my family. My husband has a good job and I stay home to take care of my handicapped grandson. We are still below the income level for CHIP.

We live paycheck to paycheck like a lot of people and can't afford to pay for healthcare. All three of my children are on CHIP and I don't know what we would do without it.

I work for a non-profit, and as is the case for many low-budget places that serve others - our wages are not terrible, but not very high either. Paying for health insurance for my two kids would be pricey (over \$400/month) and put a major strain on my ability to provide other basic needs - like food. Thanks to CHIP, my kids have access to great care at an affordable rate.

Growing up somewhat poor, my parents provided my siblings and I with all that we needed and wanted. But at one point in time, they struggled and needed help and CHIP was there to help us in this time of need. So I feel strongly about this.

Elizabeth, Pennsylvania



CHIP he is getting the care that he needs.

Right now he does have to live in a facility for mentally ill children but we are hopeful that he is going to make his breakthroughs and he's going to come home really soon. But without CHIP I don't know what would've happened to him. We really needed the help and CHIP was there for us.

If we had accumulated debt for medical care for the kids it would have been much harder to recover financially after my husband did get his job. As it was, we were able to survive the trial in good standing.

My husband carried the grandkids on his insurance but when he died, my insurance would not carry them and my daughter was forced to use CHIP. It was such a relief to know that there was something out there to help my grandchildren. Children get sick and get hurt and it is a must to be able to get help somewhere when you do not have any options.

In April of 2013, my oldest son who was 10 years old at the time, began to run fever. He said his tooth hurt. Within a few hours, his face had swollen to the point that he was no longer recognizable. I took him to the local clinic and after x-rays and blood tests, he was diagnosed with facial cellulitis, given an antibiotic and sent home. This was around 9 a.m. By 6 p.m., after taking the antibiotics and resting, he had become extremely lethargic. I rushed him to the ER.

He was transported to Medical City Children's in Dallas by ambulance. We spent 5 days in the hospital due to this infection. They pumped him with antibiotics, had a dentist come see him, a surgeon, a cardiologist, so many doctors.

They determined that the problem was a hole in his tooth because it was underdeveloped and had let the infection through to his bloodstream. He was on the verge of sepsis when we arrived at the hospital. As a single mother, I of course was terrified of what to do. He had passed the age of being eligible for Medicaid and I couldn't afford the medical bills or the oral surgeon that had to remove his two teeth when he came out of the hospital. None of it.

But I remembered that I had CHIP! I am extremely grateful for this program! It not only helped to save my child's life, but also kept me from going into debt with a hospital. He was treated with the utmost respect, as was I. It didn't matter that he wasn't on private insurance. He was covered!

I am a single mom and CHIP helped offset the high cost of my insurance premiums every month. young they were covered by CHIP. My husband worked as a carpenter, running his own business, and the only available insurance was unaffordable individual coverage. CHIP provided excellent insurance for my children, as we were able to get preventive care and treatment when they were sick.

My older son, now 8 years old, became extremely ill with RSV when he was only 9 months old. He nearly died and had to be hospitalized for several days. If it were not for CHIP we would have been financially crushed by the cost of his hospital stay and unable to pay the bills. My young-

er son, now 5 years old, was covered by CHIP at age 1.5 when he had to be hospitalized due to extremely high fevers. Again CHIP made it possible for my child to receive the care he needed without my family sinking deeper into debt.

The cost of health care is extraordinarily high and without the assistance of programs like CHIP, families who are struggling would suffer from a lack of medical care and from extreme financial hardship. I hope CHIP continues to be available to help families throughout Utah and elsewhere.

Our family is lucky because my husband and I now both have good jobs with employer-provided health benefits. One key to having made this transition was the assistance provided from programs like CHIP, allowing us to stretch each dollar and get through tough financial times.

I gave birth to twins when I had a 2 year old at home. I had to use up my 12 days of vacation before they were born, and then was out of work for another 8 weeks.

I received CHIP to supplement my own insurance through work (I was able to maintain that) which was a lifesaver – in those 8 weeks after birth, the boys were transported by emergency vehicle to the NICU where they stayed for 9 days and had two subsequent emergency room visits and hospitalizations for RSV.

Even after I went back to work, I was able to access the insurance program to help cover my portion of a surgery for each twin which would have been approximately \$8000, way out of my budget to pay.

Accessing state health insurance for the boys has been an absolute lifesaver!
